The Parliament of St. Maarten, in its meeting of today, March 19th, 2012

CONSIDERING:

2 v

- That the Preamble of the Constitution of Sint Maarten states: "WE, THE PEOPLE OF SINT MAARTEN", (are) "... DETERMINED to care for the perpetual maintenance of nature and the environment";
- That Article 22 of the Constitution of Sint Maarten states that: "It shall be the constant concern of the government to keep the country habitable and to protect and improve the natural environment and the welfare of animals";
- That Netherlands Antilles laws on the protection of Nature and Environment have been taken over by St. Maarten including the Landsverordening grondslagen natuurbeheer en bescherming (P.B. 1998, 49)";
- That Sint Maarten's ponds have been recommended for protection in reports such as *The Ponds of Sint-Maarten*, (Ecovision, 1996), the Carrying Capacity Study, the Tourism Masterplan other reports and studies which concluded that the ponds are of ecological and environmental importance;
- That until 1950 Dutch Sint Maarten boasted at least 19 ponds (all documented in maps available at the Cadastre's office); by 1995 this had been reduced to 10 ponds and today 17 years later less
- than 5 remain intact;
- That recent surveys by the Nature Foundation and Environmental Protection In the Caribbean indicated that Mullet Pond is a relatively intact ecosystem;
- That recent research supported by the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP) has valued mangroves forests at more than \$900.000,- or 1.620.000,- guilders per square kilometer per year;
- That our marine ecosystem relies on mangroves, whose complex root structure protects juvenile sea-life from predators and storms. Many of our reef dependent fish rely on mangrove forests as a nursery until they are able to survive in the open ocean. Countless organisms cling to these roots, serving dual roles as a food source and as filter feeders which remove pollutants from the water;
- That the Mullet Pond houses over 70 percent of the remaining mangrove trees on the Dutch side of the Simpson Bay Lagoon;
- That there is ongoing public debate and ever-growing concern about the destruction of St. Maarten's wetlands and the overall state of St. Maarten's natural environment;
- That it is desirable to set rules and regulations for the conservation and protection of Flora and Fauna and to establish Nature Parks on Country St. Maarten.

Having regard to:

• Various treaties that St. Maarten is signatory to concerning the conservation and protection of Flora, Fauna and Natural Habitats. Including the Ramsar Convention/Convention on

Wetlands, the Cartagena Convention and its Protocol on Specially Protected Areas and Wildlife (SPAW), The Convention on Migratory Species. (CMS or Bonn Convention);

- Articles 10, 12, 13, 14 of the "Landsverordening grondslagen natuurbeheer en bescherming (P.B. 1998, 49)";
- Article 8 of the "Eilandsverordening natuurbeheer en- bescherming Sint Maarten (Ab 2003,25)".

RESOLVES:

- That the Parliament of St. Maarten is in favour of protecting Mullet Pond and establishing the entire Mullet Pond and the associated mangroves as a Nature Park as described in Article 8 of the "Eilandsverordening natuurbeheer en- bescherming Sint Maarten (Ab 2003,25)" and Article 10 of the "Landsverordening grondslagen natuurbeheer en- bescherming (P.B. 1998, 49)".
- To charge the Council of Ministers, specifically the Minister of VROMI with the task of establishing the entire Mullet Pond as a Nature Park and to further zone the entire Mullet Pond as described in the abovementioned ordinances and further provided for in the "Eilandsverordening ruimtelijke ontwikkelingsplanning Sint Maarten (A.B. 1993, nr. 13)" within 60 days of the passing of this resolution.
