Honorable Prime Minister Jacobs,

It has been brought to the attention of Parliament by letter dated November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020 from the Secretary-General of the SER, Mr. Gerard M.C. Richardson that presently the SER is without a board. This has as a consequence that studies on the request of parliament cannot be executed without board approval as the present legislation doesn't allow such. As a result of the above, I hereby forward you the following questions to ensure that the functioning of the SER is safeguarded.

- 1) Why, to this date, are no new board members appointed to the board of the SER?
- 2) How many board members is government planning to appoint, and when does government expect to have the appointments completed?
- 3) How many board members does the present board have at the moment? Is this legal?
- 4) How important is the SER to this Government?
- 5) Is the SER allowed to render advices without a board?
